

# The Book Editing Checklist

## How to Tell if Your Book Is Ready to Publish

### Story

- Is there a clear genre?
- Is there a protagonist with a goal?
- Is there a source of conflict, an antagonist with a goal?
- Is there a change in the story from beginning to end?
- Is the point of view consistent?
- Inciting Incident: Is there a disruption at the beginning to kick off the story?
- Progressive Complications: Are there events and circumstances (positive and/or negative) that make the story increasingly complicated?
- Crisis: Does the protagonist make a major choice?
- Climax: Is there a “big event,” a climactic moment where the protagonist faces the story’s core source of conflict?
- Resolution: Is there a moment where the reader sees the new world order now that the conflict is resolved?

### Style

- Does the dialogue sound natural?
- Is there an appropriate balance of showing versus telling?
- Voice: Does the writing use words that capture the right style and tone?
- Does the story flow smoothly from beginning to end?

### Technical Elements

- Is the story free of errors in grammar, spelling, punctuation, etc.?
